103rd Loudon Classic 500 Superbike Class

Supplemental Rules and Regulations Version 1.0

These Rules and Regulations (“Rules”) are being issued for the purposes of running the 2026 500 Superbike Class event (the “Race”) run in conjunction with the 103rd Loudon Classic. These are subject to amendment or revision at any time. These Rules supplement the 2026 NEMRR Rulebook which can be found at nemrr.com. These rules are in effect for the entry, practice, qualifying and the Race unless otherwise noted.

The Race will take place June 20, 2026 at NHMS in Loudon, NH unless rescheduled as outlined in these rules. The Race will take place in conjunction with other NEMRR events on the dates of June 19-21, 2026 inclusive. More information on the schedule is on nemrr.com. The latest version will be on nemrr.com.

1.0 GENERAL

1.1 The Race will not be part of the NEMRR Race Series and will not count toward NEMRR Championship Points.

1.2 The Facilities will open and be available for this Race starting Thursday evening June 18th at 6pm. Prior access may be possible by contacting Penguin Road Racing School. Participants must be in possession of the proper NEMRR event credentials at all times.

2.0 GENERAL RACE DESCRIPTION

2.1 Race distance is scheduled for 10 laps

2.2 Races declared wet may have a reduced number of laps as determined by NEMRR. If the Race is started in the dry and declared wet there will be a 20 minute period in the pits for riders to adjust their motorcycles.

2.3 Any motorcycle that enters the paddock or the cold side of pit lane during the Race will be considered to have withdrawn from the Race and may NOT re-enter the race.

2.4 If the race is interrupted due to weather conditions on the original scheduled date, it may be re-started the following day at the discretion of NEMRR.

3.0 PRELIMINARY EVENT SCHEDULE

3.1 A preliminary event Schedule will posted be on nemrr.com.

3.2 A mandatory Riders Meeting will he held for all riders participating in practice or qualifying on Saturday June 20. Failure to attend may result in disqualification or penalty.

3.3 Practice sessions will be available on Friday June 19, following completion of the NEMRR daily schedule.

3.4 Additional practice will be available Saturday June 20.

3.5 All competitors must participate in one practice session prior to the qualifying.

4.0 QUALIFYING FOR THE RACE

4.1 A Qualifying session will be held on Saturday June 20. Qualifying results will be based on the fastest time recorded.

4.2 In the case that qualifying has been cancelled or is partially run in wet conditions then the results may be based on the times recorded in the practice sessions.

4.3 To qualify for entry in the Race a rider must achieve a time at least equal to 112% of the time recorded by the fastest rider in the qualifying sessions unless one or more sessions are declared wet or other exceptional circumstances as determined by NEMRR.

4.4 There will be a maximum of 32 grid positions for the Race unless modified by NEMRR.

4.5 Any rider who fails to achieve a qualifying time from the qualifying sessions may be granted a provisional start at the discretion of NEMRR.

4.6 Grid positions will be determined by qualifying time arranged in a 4 rider wide rows. The final grid will be published following completion of the qualifying session.

5.0 ENTRIES

5.15.1 Entries will only be accepted via

nemrr.volarehq.com/login?redirectToUrl=/registration-forms/2026-nemrr-membership opening on 2 March 2026 (QR code below). All entries are subject to acceptance by NEMRR in its sole discretion and each rider must be able to demonstrate prior race ability and experience appropriate for this Race. Entries over the initial allocation will be placed on a 'wait' list in the order received and NEMRR reserves the right to adjust the number of accepted entries.

5.2 Riders must be in possession of license issued by NEMRR, FIM, MotoAmerica or a Roadracing organization recognized by NEMRR for the class of motorcycles in the Race. Exceptions require NEMRR approval.

5.3 Entry fees are not refundable.

5.4 Riders must meet a minimum age of 16 prior to the event.

5.5 A rider shall be deemed to have started the race when the rider participates in the warm up lap for the race. A rider must complete a lap to have a finishing position.

6.0 TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS

6.1 The event is open to motorcycles which qualify under the current NEMRR 500 Superbike rules and regulations in effect at the time of the Race.

6.2 Exceptions to NEMRR Technical Specifications for the Race:

6.4 All motorcycles need to provide their own approved MyLaps transponder and the transponder must be mounted for all practice sessions, qualifying sessions and the Race.
